Welcome to all our patients to this very Special Edition of our quarterly Newsletter, which we have produced to help launch our fundraising DERMATOSCOPE APPEAL - an important initiative to enhance the care this Practice provides for patients.

Why are we fundraising?

Currently, the Surgery has only one NHS-provided dermatoscope – a vital device used to examine skin conditions and detect potentially serious issues like skin cancer – to be used for the entire surgery. Given the size of our patient list (around 12,000) and increasing demand for skin assessments, we would greatly benefit from

having an additional dermatoscope to better support our hardworking GP team. This would help improve appointment availability and deliver timely care for all our patients.

So, please support our surgery: help us purchase an additional dermatoscope. Any contribution, big or small, will bring us closer to our goal of £2,000 and help the surgery to continue to provide the highest quality care patients deserve. Remember—**Early detection gives life-saving protection.**

Non-melanoma skin cancer is the UK's most common cancer – over 260,000 cases diagnosed annually. Melanoma, the most serious skin cancer is on the increase – according to Cancer Research UK, 1 in 36 UK males and 1 in 47 UK females will be diagnosed with Melanoma skin cancer in their lifetime. Around 90% of all skin cancers are caused by damage from UVR –

always take sun safe action as a prevention.
